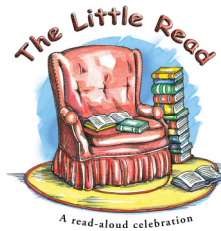
Baby Bat's Lullaby by Jacqueline Mitchard With loving words, a mother bat lulls her baby to sleep. **JE MIT***

Go Back to Sleep by Sylvie Jones A bedtime story of a child becoming parent to his toys. **JE JON***

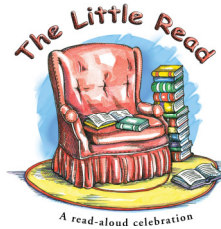
Good Knight by Linda Rymill A child insists that he is a fire chief, an admiral, and a king in order to delay going to bed. **JE RYM***

It's Too Soon! by Nigel McMullen Anna thinks it is too early to go to bed, but her grandfather leads her one step at a time. **JE MCM***

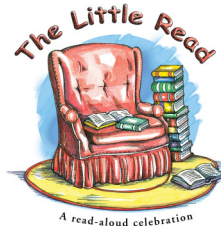
