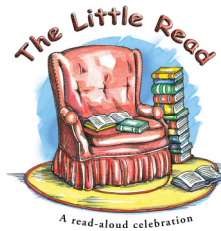

I Love Trains! by Philemon Sturges A boy expresses his love of trains, describing many kinds of train cars and their special jobs. **JE STU***

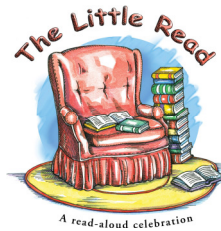

Night Train by Caroline Stutson Rhyming text presents a nighttime train ride through the countryside with the lights of the station at the end of the journey. **JE STU***

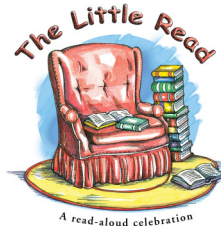
