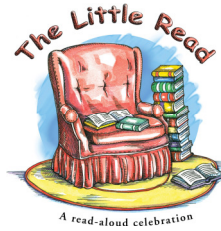

Red Light, Green Light by Anastasia Suen A young boy creates an imaginary world filled with zooming cars, traffic lights and racing fire engines. **JE SUE***

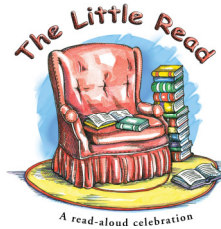
Scrubbly-Bubbly Car Wash by Irene O'Garden Rhyming text describes what happens as a car goes through a car wash. **JE OGA***

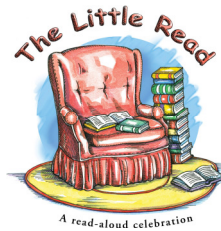

Truck Goes Rattley-Bumpa by Jonathan London Describes trucks of all sizes, shapes and colors doing a variety of tasks. **JE LON***

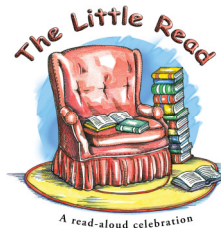
Truck Song by Diane Siebert Rhymed text and illustrations describe the journey of a transcontinental truck. **JE SIE***
